



ATTN: Students of Higher Education, New College Swindon. 15-01-2021

This communication is to provide you with information about the current position of the College, with regard to the HE provision at the college here in Swindon, since the National Lockdown.

Those of you who are students studying with us on a course franchised with our university partners, will have received email bulletins to update on the approach of that University at this time, and so we are writing to explain the approach the College is taking in line with Government guidance for [FE Colleges](#) during National Lockdown. We are taking into account advice provided by Government to the [University sector](#) and from the [Office for Students](#), recognising that our provision does not have student accommodation and we are operating in a different context to that of the University sector.

Once again we have moved all teaching, learning and assessment on-line. In dialogue with your lecturers, and in liaison with our awarding partners, we have assessed where any changes to your course or assessment may be needed in the coming weeks. Any minor changes, or delivery on-line will not in the majority of cases, materially change your course or learning outcomes. In a small number of cases, such as exams, we will make alternative arrangements to do this on-line where possible or we may consider on site activity if we feel it is needed and we can keep everybody safe. Any changes will be communicated to you by your Programme Leader.

It is understood from the Government guidance to date, that we will continue with on-line delivery up to February half term, 15th February 2021. As we approach this date we will be taking account of any further guidance or changes to the current Lockdown as they are announced, and will communicate any changes as soon as possible.

We hope that by attending as much as possible in this first Semester of the year, you will have benefitted from the face to face teaching, learning and feedback of your lecturers, and valuable in person interaction with your peer group.

Your lecturers are working hard to provide live streaming, Teams and using other platforms to help you engage and successfully continue with your studies. If you are having any difficulties with your course, such as access to teaching, learning or assessment please contact them in the first instance. If you are experiencing financial hardship which is affecting your ability to participate in your studies then please contact HEsupport@swindon.ac.uk for advice on how to apply for hardship funding. There are other avenues of support available within the College which we can also refer you to.

We understand these are challenging times and you may feel isolated or anxious.
